Harm reduction and medical services will be available during IAS 2023, the 12th IAS Conference on HIV Science, in Brisbane, Australia, from 23 July to 26 July 2022.

In collaboration with local harm reduction service facilities and medical professionals in Brisbane, IAS – the International AIDS Society – will ensure that these services are available to all delegates joining us in Brisbane throughout the conference.

While in Brisbane, the IAS is required to follow rules and guidelines for the provision of harm reduction services as determined by local public health services.

Community organizations in Brisbane

The following organizations provide information and services for HIV and sexually transmitted and blood-borne infections (STBBI) prevention and support to local communities:

- Queensland Positive People (QPP): QPP is a peer-led, community-based organization committed to improving the lives of all people living with HIV across Queensland.
- Queensland Council for LGBTI Health (QC): The Queensland Council for LGBTI Health has been a home for lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, intersex, queer, sistergirl and brotherboy people and communities in Queensland for over 35 years. The QC is proud to be a community-led and community-owned health and well-being service, representing the diversity of Queensland communities.
- Respect: This provides drop-in and outreach services for sex workers in Queensland.
- QuIHN: QuIHN provides health services to people who use substances across Queensland.

Queensland Needle and Syringe Program - Biala

The Queensland Needle and Syringe Program (QNSP) aims to reduce the incidence of blood-borne viruses and injection-related injuries and disease in Queensland by providing sterile injecting equipment, facilitating the safe disposal of used injecting equipment, and improving access and referral to drug treatment programmes, healthcare and other services.

Better Access Medical - QuIHN

QuIHN operates a Needle and Syringe Program and bulk-billing general practice called Better Access Medical.

Located at 1 Hamilton Place, Bowen Hills, QuIHN offers:

- Free sterile injecting equipment and used needle disposal options
- Education and support around substance use, overdose, safe injecting practices, blood-borne viruses and sexual health
- Free naloxone
- Free hepatitis C testing and treatment
- Free testing for HIV and syphilis
- Counselling services
- Therapeutic groups

Please note that to access some services, you will be asked for your name and date of birth, but will not be required to provide identification. QuIHN services everyone, including people not eligible for Medicare or uninsured people.

QCGP+ Inclusive Chosen Families General Practice

Situated 4.8km from the IAS 2023 venue, QCPP+ is a community-led inclusive chosen family's general practice in downtown Brisbane. Its nurses and doctors offer peer-based confidential consultations and provide an inclusive, non-judgemental, knowledgeable and caring approach to healthcare provision. The practice is unable to see people without a valid Medicare card. Please ring if you do not have a valid Medicare card to discuss alternate services.

Services provided:

Testing and treatment for sexually transmissible infections, blood and swab collection for testing (including blood-borne viruses, such as HIV, hepatitis, herpes and HPV), advice and education, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP)*, vaccinations; prescription and administration of vaccines (both private and provided under the National Immunisation Program Schedule), sexual health check, Certificate of Attendance for sex industry workers, healthcare for persons living with HIV, trans and gender-diverse healthcare

Where to find naloxone in Brisbane

Australia has a National Take Home Naloxone programme, which makes naloxone available for free for people who are vulnerable to, or who may witness, an opioid overdose or adverse reaction (such as friends, family and community members). There is no cost to individuals, nor prescription required. Naloxone is a life-saving, fast-acting, temporary opioid antagonist (that is, it inhibits the action of opioids). Under the Take Home Naloxone programme, free naloxone is available from participating pharmacies, Needle and Syringe Programs, alcohol and other drug treatment services and other social services. If you need prescriptions filled for opioid dependence treatment (ODT), such as methadone or buprenorphine, while in Brisbane, please contact your local doctor before travelling to Brisbane. Please note that dispensing medications must be paid for directly at the pharmacy.

If you are travelling with medicines, ensure that what you are carrying complies with the restrictions by the Australia Department of Home Affairs and the Therapeutic Goods Administration regarding rules for bringing medicines into Australia, including limitations on liquids.

Information about the use of drugs while in Brisbane

According to 2022-23 data collected through Needle and Syringe Programs, the most popular drugs for injecting are crystal methamphetamine, PIED-AAS (anabolic-androgenic steroids), heroin and pharmaceutical opioids, such as morphine and oxycodone.

As of April 2023, drug testing services are not widely available in Brisbane.

In case of an overdose, call 000 and tell them there has been an overdose. If you have naloxone, administer it before the ambulance arrives. The ambulance service in Queensland is free.
